Those seeking relaxation should consider signing on for a "Diablo Downtime" weekend, when good eating, yoga, hiking and other tonics dominate the schedule. If your curious mind seeks more, spend a weekend tracking warblers, vireos, thrushes and tanagers with an expert birder. Or learn to paint watercolor scenes of the jagged green and white peaks jutting up from glacial blue waters.

Getting away from it all at the lakeside campus is the ultimate resort of the intellectually curious. Facilities include dorms for 92 guests, a dining hall, multimedia classrooms, a research library, an earth sciences lab, canoes and a dock on Diablo Lake, and trails radiating into North Cascades National Park.
