

PURPOSE

North Cascades Institute's Youth Leadership Adventures builds the next generation of conservation leaders by providing a suite of transformational learning experiences for youth who lack access to similar opportunities. The goal is to provide a gateway for youth to jumpstart their lifelong engagement with nature, stewardship and community and to provide an opportunity for personal, academic, and professional growth. The program uses a tiered tuition structure with scholarships available.



FORMAT

Youth Leadership Adventures backcountry courses take place in North Cascades National Park and Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest. Transportation to the program site, gear, and food is provided. **Key program components in 2013 included:**
