We were drawn to field-based education and we knew that we needed to engage all parts of our brains and bodies to succeed: science and art, facts and feelings, notebooks and hiking boots.

That led to the creation of North Cascades Institute in 1986, and for 30 years we've been walking and learning together in the mountains. Thanks to each of you who have journeyed with us thus far and to those that have recently joined us to learn, explore and protect your wild nearby.
